**REPORT OF ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED BY YOUTH PARLIAMENT
SOCIETY IN THE COLLEGE**

(2019-2020)

On the occasion of Samvidhan Diwas (Constitution Day), the College, under the aegis of its 'Youth Parliament' Society conducted several activities on 26th Nov, 2019, to mark the Celebration of Samvidhan Diwas in honour of the Constitution of India.

1. The Celebrations began with the students, teachers and the staff organising a Pledge Ceremony. The Preamble to the Constitution of India was read by the students and staff.
2. Next a pledge was taken upholding the Fundamental Duties of the citizens, as enshrined in Part IV-A of the Constitution. Both the pledges were recited in Hindi and English. All the students, teachers and staff took a pledge to uphold the essence of the Constitution in letter and spirit.
3. At 1100 hours, the Hon'ble Prime Minister, Sh. Narendra Modi Ji's interaction with the nation was telecasted and played Live in the College. The PM was addressing a Joint Session of the Parliament where he upheld the spirit and significance of the Constitution. The event was streamed Live for the students, teachers and para-teaching staff of the College.

The College invited a speaker and an expert on Indian Constitution to enlighten the students as well as the College staff on the salient aspects of Indian Constitution as well as Fundamental Rights of the citizens. Dr. Ritu Kohli was invited for the lecture. Dr. Kohli is working as an Associate Professor at the Department of Political Science, Maharaja Agrasen College, University of Delhi. Her 45 minute long lecture enlightened the audience on significance of the Constitution and its legacy. She gave an elaborate lecture on Fundamental Duties and also Fundamental Rights of the citizens. This was followed by an elaborate interactive session with students, faculty as well as the para-teaching staff of the College.
